Welcome!

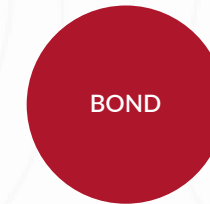

Discover AGH University

How it all started

At the beginning of the 20th century, a group of prominent engineers and mining activists, led by Jan Zdrański, went to great lengths to obtain approval for establishing a higher education institution in Krakow to educate mining engineers. Concentrated diplomatic action was taken in Vienna to win the favour of the Austrian government.

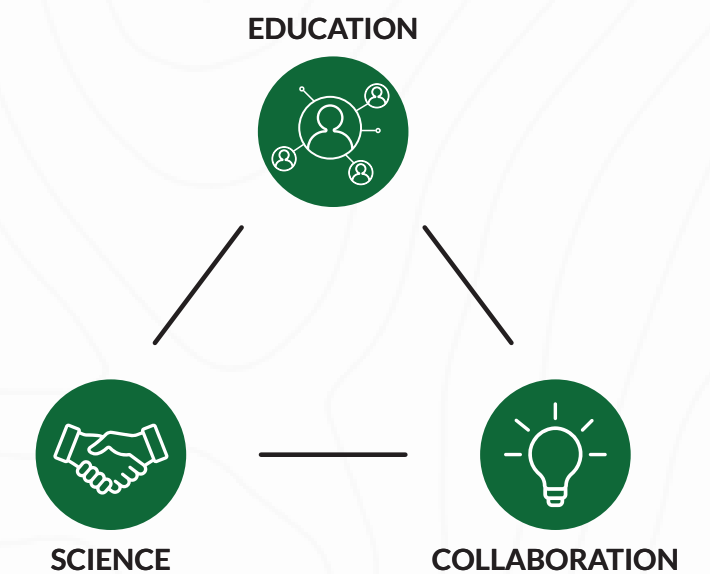
These efforts were successful, and on July 10, 1912, Krakow authorities received a permit to establish a mining academy, known today as AGH University of Krakow. Research University AGH University of Krakow provides education and carries out scientific research in line with the contemporary needs of the economy. This social side of the university's activities influences the development of research areas and the creation of new fields of study.

Our goal is to act in a triangle that combines SCIENCE – producing knowledge, EDUCATION – internal transfer of knowledge according to the model “mentor–mentee”, and COLLABORATION WITH SURROUNDINGS – external transfer of knowledge.

As an academically diverse university with a social mission, we develop timeless values: fundamental and applied knowledge, an ethos of an employee, student and graduate, as well as their practical skills, and the so-called “soft skills”. It is also important for the university to encourage patriotic and pro-social attitudes. At the same time, we create tangible things such as publications, scientific projects, contracts for the economy, study programmes, buildings, laboratories, patents, etc. In the concept of the university of values, these two areas are particularly important and complementary.

AGH University focuses on the following research areas:

- Sustainable energy technologies, renewable sources of energy, and energy storage
- New technologies for the circular economy
- Water – Energy – Climate: an interdisciplinary approach to sustainable development
- Technical solutions: from fundamental research, through modelling and design, to prototypes
- Materials, technologies, and processes inspired by nature
- Intelligent information, telecommunication, computer, and control and operation technologies
- Design, production, and testing of modern materials and the technologies of the future
- Crossing boundaries: experimental high energy physics, extreme states of matter, transdisciplinary applications

International cooperation

International cooperation is coordinated by the **Centre for International Affairs**.

AGH University has signed nearly 300 general cooperation agreements with universities in more than 60 countries (the majority in Ukraine, France, the People's Republic of China, and the United States of America), more than 600 Erasmus+ bilateral and 31 double diploma agreements (including one within the prestigious T.I.M.E. programme), as well as an agreement on a joint education programme with the Shibaura Institute of Technology in Japan (within the NAWA KATAMARAN programme).

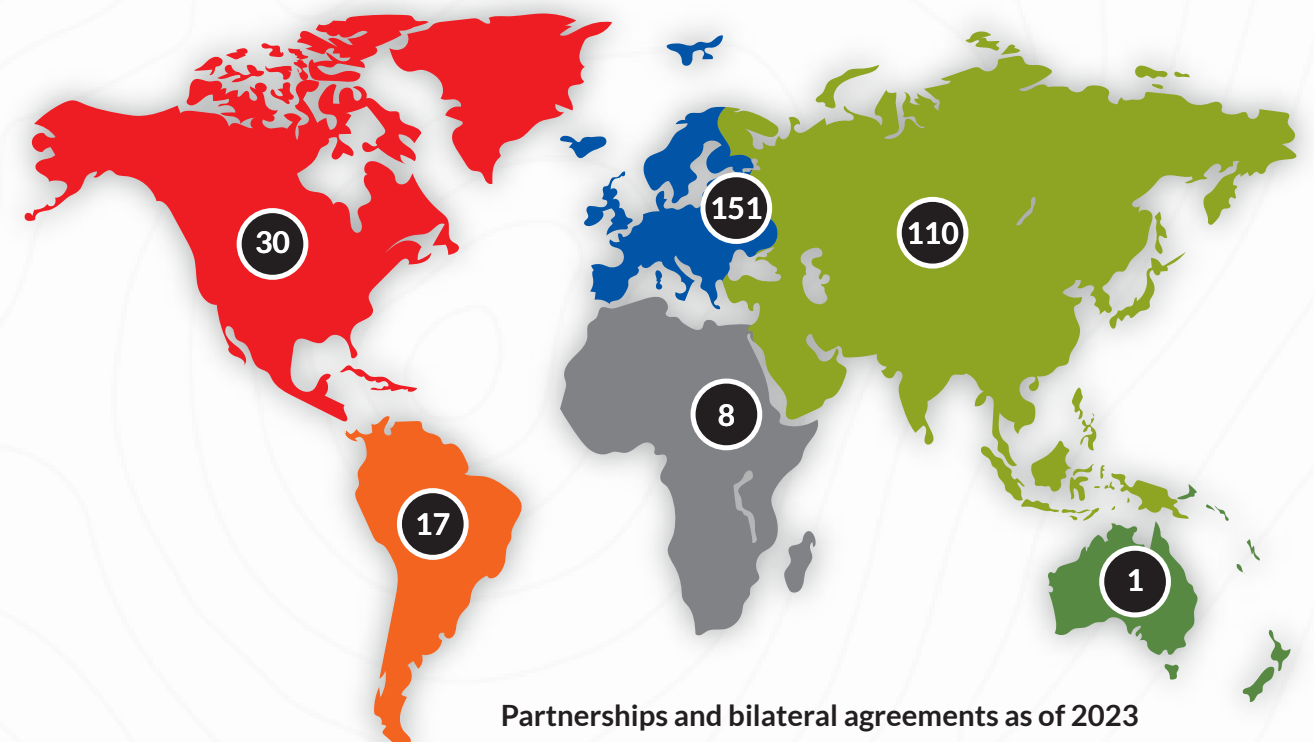
Every year, around **700 students and 130 employees** participate in the Erasmus+ programme of academic exchange.

Furthermore, each year, our university hosts more than a dozen visiting professors – prominent researchers and popularisers of science from all over the world.

Research University

AGH University is one of 10 Polish higher education institutions distinguished in a ministerial programme titled Excellence Initiative – Research University (IDUB). The status of a research university comes with additional funds that can be spent on:

- Study visits and internships at international research centres
- University grants
- Awards for scientific achievements
- Purchase of research equipment
- Visits of scientists and researchers from all over the world
- Funding the open-access feature and publications in commercial scientific journals.
- This allows academic staff to focus on scientific activity and improve the quality of education.
- The IDUB programme supports academic career at each stage, offering:
- Substantial scholarships for the best students in the AGH Doctoral School
- Minigrants to support research for doctoral students and young scientists
- Postdoctoral packages including financing of research costs and trips, internships in Poland and abroad, translation and publication processes, as well as possible teaching load reductions and periodic bonuses to compensation

Space University

Since 2020, the AGH University has been a member of the UNIVERSEH project (European Space University for Earth and Humanity), carried out in cooperation with Université de Toulouse (France), Heinrich-Heine-Universität (Germany), the Luleå University of Technology (Sweden), and the University of Luxembourg (Luxembourg).

The institutions composing UNIVERSEH have obtained the status of a European University, awarded by the European Commission to international partnerships of higher education institutions across the EU. The AGH tasks in the project focus on education and conducting scientific and technological research related to the exploration and use of space.

UNIVERSEH means:

- € 5,000,000 budget
- 144,000 students and employees in partner universities
- 60 supporting companies.

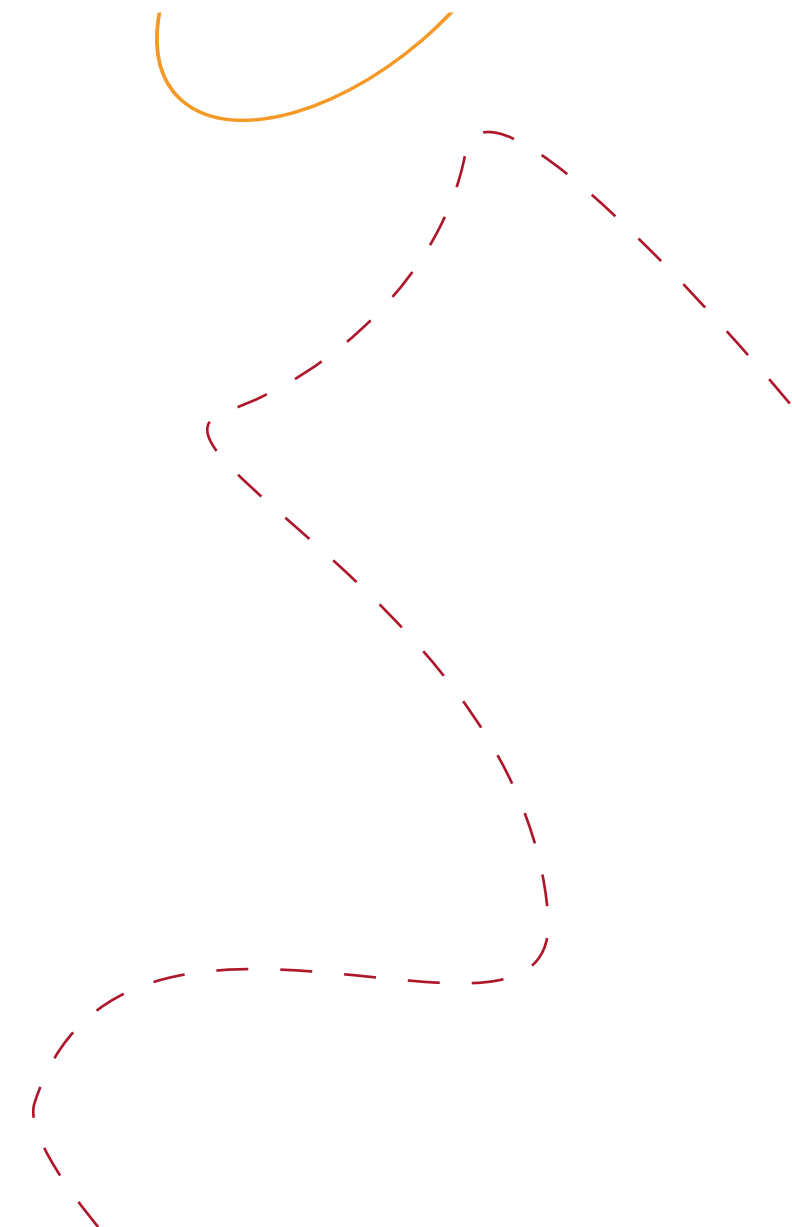
The implementation of the project helps its participants tailor their offers to the current needs of the market. The opportunity to exchange experiences and network with the space industry contributes to the creation of pioneering fields of study.

Space Technology Centre

The establishment of the Space Technology Centre in 2020 was one of the first endeavours of the AGH within UNIVERSEH. Its objectives include the co-ordination of AGH-based research projects related to space technologies, as well as carrying out fundamental and applied research, especially in the fields of science of signature (transformation of information into knowledge), materials and structures designed to be used in space, and space resources (in the area of minerals). The Centre also focuses on educational and informational activities. The Space Technology Centre is also planning to launch a Polish scientific satellite into LEO (Low Earth Orbit) to conduct observations of the Earth.

Main tasks of the Space Technology Centre:

- Carrying out research in the field of space technologies (resources, infrastructure, establishment of interdisciplinary research teams)
- Development of equipment and laboratories Extending the AGH research and implementation offer in the area of space technologies
- In cooperation with space- related industries
- Cooperation with other AGH units and research institutions in Poland and abroad Initiating and developing collaboration with industry,
- As well as space institutions and agencies
- Developing specialised education programmes in the field of space technologies
- Education and promotion of knowledge related to outer space



Legal arrangements

Insurance

All scholarship holders and accompanying family members must take out health insurance, which covers them from the first day of their stay in Poland.

There are two ways to obtain health insurance in Poland: public and private.

Health insurance covers illness, accident, injury, poisoning, life-threatening conditions, etc.

A monthly fee must be paid to benefit from such insurance. Foreigners who are insured can use public health care services free of charge.

Non-public healthcare is only free if the facility or doctor has a contract with the National Health Service (Narodowy Fundusz Zdrowia – NFZ).

As a general rule, people working in Poland on the basis of an employment contract and a contract of mandate, regardless of nationality, are subject to compulsory health insurance. In addition, all residents of European Union countries and the European Economic Area are entitled to get free public health care offered by NFZ. They only need to have health insurance in their country and provide the appropriate documents. Before coming to Poland, they have to get a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).

Visa

1. Schengen visa

The Uniform Schengen Visa (C-type visa) is valid in the Schengen Area and permits its holder to remain in the territory of all of the Schengen Area Member Countries for a maximum of 90 days during a 180-day period.

Schengen Visa with limited territorial validity is valid in the territory of one or more Schengen Area Member States, but not in all the Schengen Area Member States and permits its holder to remain in their territories for a maximum of 90 days during a 180-day period.

2. National visa

A D-type national visa also permits to travel in the territory of other Schengen Area Member States for up to 90 days during a 180-day period, during the validity period of the visa.

A D-type national visa permits one to enter the territory of the Republic of Poland and to stay continuously or for several successive times in this territory for a total duration of more than 90 days during the period of validity of the visa, but not longer than one year.

Registration at the Voivodeship Office

1. EU citizens or EEA

If you stay longer than 3 months you are required to register at the Voivodeship Office of the region (voivodeship) where you are staying. In the case of Krakow, it is a Lesser Poland Voivodeship Office (Małopolski Urząd Wojewódzki).

2. Non-EU citizens

Citizens of countries other than member states of the EU and EEA have four days for registering their short-term (shorter than three months) stay, starting from the moment of entering the Polish territory, unless they do not wish to spend more than 14 days in Poland.

If you plan to stay for a period longer than your visa allows, you should apply for a fixed-time residence permit. You need to register no later than on the last day of your legal stay (e.g. the last day of your visa validity).

Please note that the procedure takes a couple of months. You should submit all the necessary documents as soon as possible.

Registration at the Municipality Office

What is a municipality/district office?

In addition to having a visa and other permits, it is mandatory for all visitors, but also for Polish nationals to register their stay in a municipality of your city/town.

Time frames

You need to register if you are:

- an EU citizen staying in Poland for more than 3 months – register within the first 30 days after your arrival
- a non-EU citizen staying in Poland for more than 30 days – register within the first 4 days after your arrival

PESEL number

PESEL number is a unique personal identification number that every Polish citizen must have. It is required for example to open a bank account, submit your annual tax declaration, and makes it easier to use medical services. It starts with your date of birth.

PESEL number is useful to manage certain formalities such as opening a bank account, registering for a doctor or submitting your annual tax declaration.

How to get a PESEL number?

PESEL is automatically assigned to you when you register at the municipality/district office. It is mandatory for all incoming who are staying:

- for more than 3 months -> for EU/EEA citizens
- for more than 30 days -> for all other nationalities



Living in Kraków

Transportation

There are plenty of tram and bus lines in Kraków that will help you get around the city and beyond. Transport tickets can be purchased in many different ways and places:

1. via various apps, such as JakDojadę, SkyCash, moBILET etc. – it is also possible to buy transportation tickets via your bank's app (e.g. Millenium Bank, Santander Bank...)
2. at ticket machines at bus stops or on buses/tram -> in the majority of them you can pay by card, but there are still some old machines on the trams that only takes cash, so it is good to have a couple of coins.

There is no difference between tickets for trams and buses in Kraków – you can use the same ticket for both.

We have two types of tickets: full-price ("normalny") and discounted ("ulgowy"). In general, students are eligible to purchase discounted tickets, if they have a valid student ID with them. Children below 7 years old can travel free of charge, as well as primary school pupils. It is also possible to buy a seasonal ticket.

Cars and parking

Parking spaces can be found in limited numbers around the institutes of the AGH Univeristy.

Parking in the street is partly subject to charge. Please note that not paying the charge may lead to a fine.

Paid parking zones in Krakow operate from Monday to Saturday, between 10 am and 8 pm. They are marked as „P płatny”.

To pay for the parking, use the dedicated machines or mobile apps – each machine has a sticker showing in which zone you currently are: A, B or C. In each zone, the fare is different:

- zone A – 6 PLN / hour
- zone B – 5 PLN / hour
- zone C – 4 PLN / hour

Please remember to put the printed ticket from the machine behind the windscreen of your car.

Tourists who want to plan their routes in Kraków will find plenty of opportunities to rent vehicles adjusted to their needs.

Bank account

What documents do I need to open a bank account in Poland?

If you have an address of residence in Poland, opening a bank account is very easy – in some cases banks will allow you to open one without visiting a branch, using video identification or even sending you the final documents to sign by post, with the postman having the authority to verify your identity. For non-residents, it can be a little more complicated – but several banks now offer the possibility to open a bank account by providing only an identity document, such as a passport. The best thing to do is to check with the banks to see what their requirements are.

Here are the documents that will be required when opening a bank account:

- Passport or a national identification card
- Proof of address, such as a tenancy agreement or residence card, or utility bill if you do not already have a contract
- For credit cards or overdraft options: employment history and salary slips

Banks in Poland usually have English-speaking employees, and it shouldn't be difficult to get support in English via phone and customer service centres. If you have questions regarding the required documents, contact your preferred bank via phone.

Accommodation

In terms of location, the AGH University of Krakow is centralized and all faculties' buildings are situated within 40ha. If you are planning a research stay at AGH University, it is good to know that the district's name is Krowodrza. If you rent a flat near the Campus, you will be able to reach the university within a couple of minutes on foot.

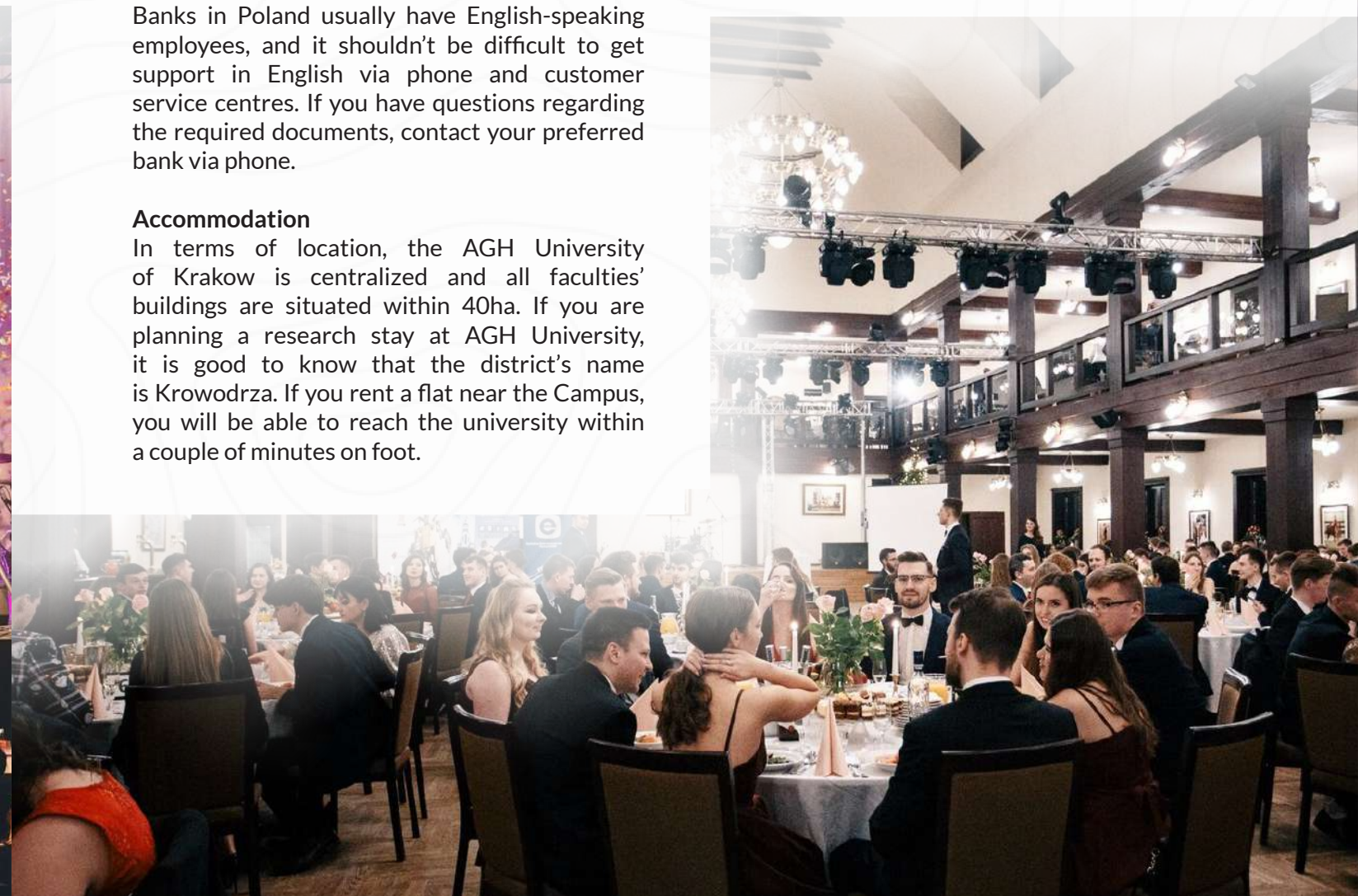
We recommend you start your search for a flat as early as possible. The AGH University Student Campus provides accommodation for medium and long-term stays (up to 1 year) for international visiting scholars (postdoc and above). Since the demand is much higher than the capacity, please contact us as early as possible.

It is very popular to look for an apartment on Facebook and its different groups – please be careful as this is not the most secure form of communication, but definitely the most used nowadays. You can check out also: www.otodom.pl, www.olx.pl or other rental agencies.



Phone number

The first step is to buy a Polish SIM card – there are many different mobile operators: Orange, PLAY, Plus, T-Mobile, etc. You can check their offers online, on their official websites.

Starters are available at airports, in dedicated shops of the service providers or regular shops such as Żabka or RUCH.

Next, you need to register your number using your passport or ID card at the location of purchase. After this procedure, your SIM card is ready to use!

A unique campus – a city within a city

All faculties, student organisations, the AGH Student Campus along with student clubs and sports facilities make up a condensed 40- hectare hub, forming a compact complex so you can plan many activities without wasting time – the majority of buildings can be reached within a 15-minute walk.

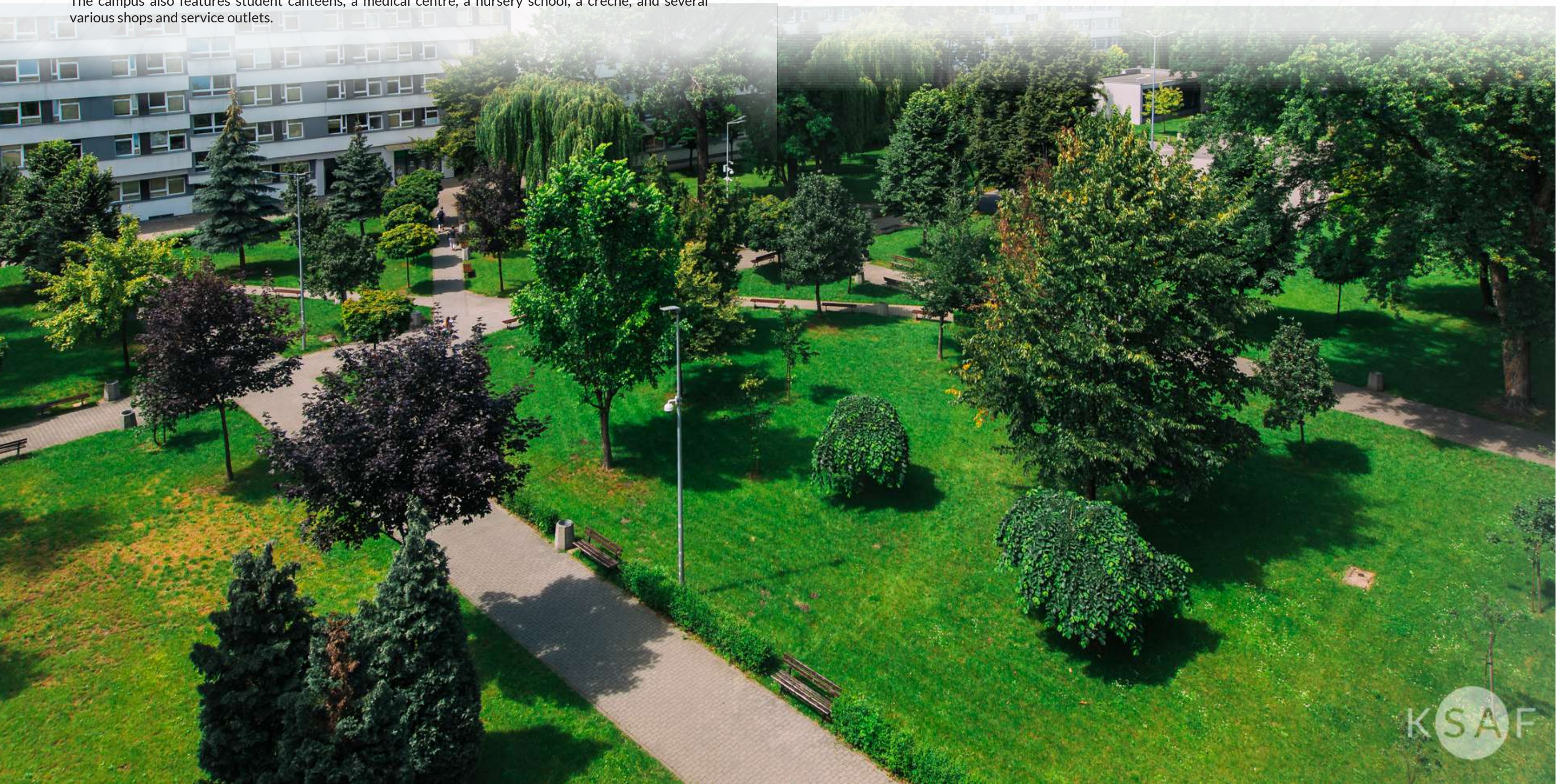
AGH University Student Campus is the largest academic settlement in Poland located on the university campus. It is located between Reymonta, Buszka, Tokarskiego, Armii Krajowej, Nawojki and Miechowska streets.

It is only a 15-minute walk between the Main Building and the Krakow Main Square. The entire area is conveniently connected with other parts of the city thanks to an extensive network of trams and buses. The campus also features student canteens, a medical centre, a nursery school, a crèche, and several various shops and service outlets.

Infrastructure

In recent years, thanks to several construction and modernisation projects, the AGH University Campus has gained a very modern look. The latest developments include a new building for the Faculty of Physics and Applied Computer Science, new buildings for the Faculty of Humanities and the Faculty of Applied Mathematics, and, last but not least, a modern sports hall and the AGH UST Student Construction Centre.

Most buildings are equipped with special lifts and ramps for wheelchair users and other facilities, such as induction loops, room labelling in Braille, and height-adjustable desks. The AGH University Campus is protected by a 24/7 video surveillance system.



The largest student accommodation in Poland

The Campus covers an impressive area of 13 ha. The residents can reach the university buildings in 10 minutes. 20 dormitories with 7,500 beds provide students with comfortable conditions – fast Internet connection, designated places for learning, TV rooms, and club rooms. The room standard is regularly improved.

On top of that, there are sports fields and tennis courts. An unquestionable asset of the campus is a modern swimming pool with a gym. The proximity to Krakow Błonia Park and Park Jordana allows runners, joggers, cyclists, and roller skaters to spend their free time actively in the picturesque and green areas of the city. During summer, the AGH University Student Campus turns into the largest hostel in Krakow.

The green area of the city

AGH University buildings are submerged in greenery and trees. Their architecture – monolithic, classical forms – enforces the way of arranging plants, which fit into the picture and create a well-thought-out whole. Each year, new green arrangements are being made. Blooming seasonal plants, perennials, shrubs, and trees attract insects, including bees, for which several hives have been located on the roofs of the Faculty of Materials Science and Ceramics and in the neighbourhood of Klub STUDIO.

The walkways and squares of the campus create a unique gallery. The open-air collection includes sculptures by Bronisław Chromy, a famous Krakow artist, and students of the Academy of Fine Arts in Krakow.



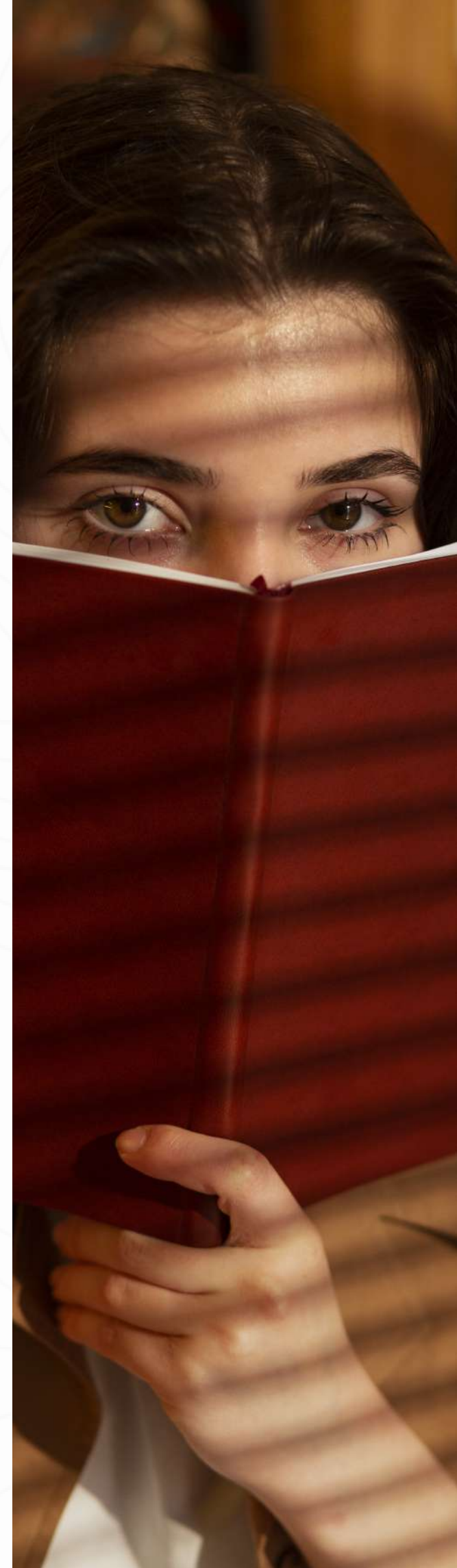


Before you leave – checklist

Before you leave Poland, you should take care of a couple of things to fulfil the necessary formalities.

Here you can find a checklist, that can help you with all the arrangements.

1. If you have registered for temporary residence in a municipal/district office, you will be automatically de-registered after the expiry of the registration period;
2. Terminate your accommodation contract and comply with the formalities with regard to leaving your flat/room;
3. Pay all your liabilities;
4. If you opened a bank account, close the account;
5. Make sure you obtain the documents you are obligated to submit to the institution financing your stay in Poland to settle it;
6. Collect employment documents: employment certificate and a copy of the employment contract;
7. Notify the AGH University Centre for International Affairs about your departure.



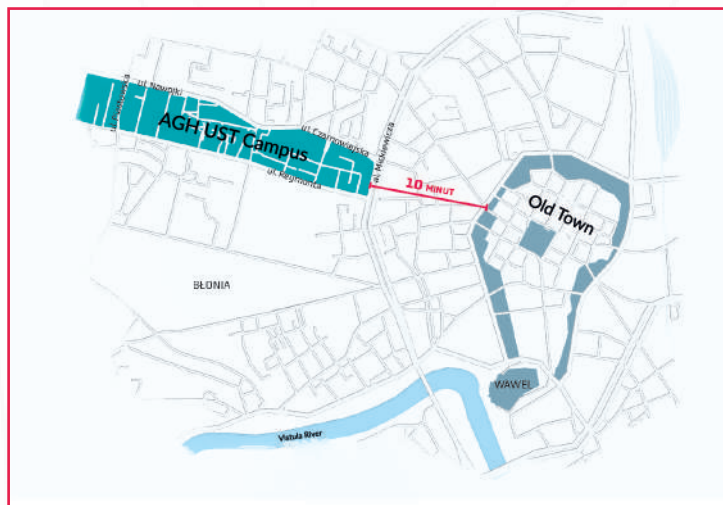
